This was just what Ester needed, someone to take care of and she was just what Wayne needed, someone to take care of him. It was a perfect partnership that lasted 50 years until his death. Ester has carried on managing the family farm until the very end. She was involved in 4-H, as a leader and judging at fairs. Her faith kept her very active in the church and community. She was a member of the choir, Clover Leaf Club, UMW and wherever she was needed. She learned to cut hair by sitting in the car outside the barbershop and watching. Wayne never had to pay for another haircut. There was always a large vegetable garden, canning, sewing all her clothes, her girl's clothes, and others. She loved to cook. If you ever stopped by the farm, the kitchen table was a place for conversation and homemade goodies. After retirement, Wayne and Ester took off in their motor home to Arizona or Florida for three months during the winters. They were like little kids at camp, Wayne playing pool and doing crafts while Ester enjoyed silversmithing and other crafts. She loved to 'visit' and had the gift of 'talking' and remembering people and their names. She touched everyone she met and always had something to say. To her, it could be a 'teachable moment'.
